The University and The Student agreed as follows:

1. The Student is obliged to attend the EMJM SBBE programme, having duration of two years, beginning on the 1st of September 2022, in accordance with the programme of studies defined by the SBBE Consortium and according to the studying and mobility scheme shown in Appendix. The studies are financially supported by the European Education and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA).

The SBBE Consortium consists of the following universities: 1) Wrocław University of Science and Technology (WUST), Poland, 2) University of Castilla-La Mancha (UCLM), Spain, 3) Lappeenranta-Lahti University of Technology LUT (LUT), Finland (hereinafter referred to as "SBBE Consortium Institutions" or "Partner Institutions"). The Student participating in the SBBE programme has to be admitted to each SBBE Partner Institution.

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* In case the Student fails to physically participate in the courses due to circumstances outside of Student control (e.g. COVID-19 or other pandemic, travel restrictions, student's visa procedure, etc.), the Student will have to present to the SBBE Consortium Institutions evidence(s) proving that he/she has undertaken all the necessary actions and is not at fault. In this case the Consortium will consider modification the Student's participation in the SBBE programme. For the period of the Student's absence, the scholarship will be withheld.

2. The attendance referred to point 1 of this Agreement will be recognized by the respective SBBE Consortium institutions as integral part of the qualification for which the Student is preparing, as long as the Student is successful in the respective examinations and assessments.
3. A Master thesis project may be proposed by the SBBE Consortium Institutions, and all Associated Partners. The specific quotas are defined by the Consortium Committee. The defences of Master Thesis will take place at WUST.
4. The successful completion of the curriculum is rewarded by the following national diplomas:
 1. degree from WUST: Inżynieria Chemiczna i Procesowa
 2. degree from UCLM: Master en Ingeniería Química
 3. degree from LUT: Kemianteekniikan diplomi-insinööri

Diploma documents include Diploma Supplement.

For the sake of clarity, it is stated that the Student must fulfil the SBBE Partner Institution's degree requirements to graduate from the said SBBE Partner Institution.

The Student must be enrolled at Lappeenranta-Lahti University of Technology (LUT) for the first semester of his/her third study year to be able to complete the SBBE Programme.

5. The SBBE Partner Institutions will provide the Student with tuition, supervision and support services of a professional standard. Services include visa and housing support, access to libraries, social services, internet and sport facilities, local language courses and administrative support. The Student will be familiarized with the SBBE programme, its generic requirements and regulations with regard to the assessment criteria, timeframes, performance thresholds and mobility arrangements.
6. The Student is obliged to participate in the SBBE Programme's surveys and/or evaluations.
7. Wrocław University of Science and Technology (WUST) as a Programme Coordinator shall pay to the Student the scholarship in the amount of EUR 1400 (in words: euros one thousand four hundred) per month for the duration of 24 months.
 - 7.1. The scholarship shall be paid in advance until the 10th day of each month from..... to The first payment will be made by the 30th of September.....(year).
 - 7.2. The Student is required to submit a bank account number from a Polish bank before the first payment.
8. The Student is **not** entitled to receive any contribution to travel and relocation costs.





9. The SBBE Partner Institutions will arrange and cover the Student's health, accident, civil liability, luggage & household insurance costs for the duration of the Programme (to be provided by the external insurance company) as stipulated in the Article 18 of the Grant Agreement No 101050789
10. The SBBE Partner Institutions will organize the Summer School and cover Student's participation costs. The Summer School budget will partially be used for social and cultural activities towards students' integration. The SBBE Consortium will also cover the costs related to the issuing the diploma.
11. In case of a complaint, the student may appeal to the SBBE Consortium Committee. For specific complaint about a specific service or facility provided by a Partner Institution or Associate Partner, the Student shall invoke the complaint procedure of that institution.
12. The Student shall comply at all times with all laws, regulations, codes of practice and directions issued by the Partner Institution/Associate Partner and which are applicable to
 - (a) the study programme being carried out by the Student; or
 - (b) the Student's presence in or on land or buildings owned, occupied or under the control of the relevant Partner Institution/Associate Partner. The Student understands that he/she could be excluded from the SBBE programme:
 - i) In case of non-attendance to the SBBE programme (lectures, seminars, practical sessions, information sessions, Summer School, official meetings, and others) that the Student cannot justify with medical certificates or for which permission has not been granted by the SBBE Local Coordinator (the Student should seek permission in advance),
 - ii) If the Student is subject to disciplinary measures leading to his/her expulsion from the SBBE Partner Institutions or Associate Partners Institutions
 - iii) If the Student is subject to legal prosecutions that prevent him/her from attending the SBBE programme,
 - iv) If the Student withdraws from the SBBE programme on his/her own decision or by force majeure.
13. Any deliberate failure on the part of the Student to fulfil the conditions expected in terms of attendance at the EMJM SBBE programme, in particular non-fulfilment of the conditions stipulated in the present Agreement, constitutes sufficient reason for action to be taken towards resolving the issue and could lead to reimbursement of the scholarship awarded. In the case of reimbursement, the Coordinating Institution will determine the amount to be reimbursed.
14. The Student allows their data to be used for the purposes of evaluating the teaching programme, efficiently manage the SBBE project, and producing statistics. Data could be made available to the EACEA, the European Commission, the European External Action Service staff, as well as to other stakeholders of the Erasmus+ programme, such as Erasmus+ National Agencies, National Erasmus + Offices and the Erasmus Mundus Student and Alumni Association.
15. The scholarship does not create or entitle an employer-employee relation between the Coordinating Institution and the Student, and therefore is not subject to direct taxation.





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16. The Student is not entitled to embark on any full-time occupation with a regular salary in parallel to the studies under the Erasmus Mundus Joint Master programme.
17. Any changes to the present Agreement must be made in writing. All changes to the initial situation must be immediately communicated by the Student to the Coordinating Institution. Upon mutual agreement of contractual modifications, the Coordinating Institution will issue an addendum to the present Agreement.
18. Without prejudice to the general consequences laid down in Polish law applicable to the present Agreement, the Coordinating Institution reserves the right to cease the effects of the present Agreement based on justified reasons, without recourse to any juridical procedure apart from adequate communication to the Student. Failing agreement by both parts, the Polish courts are designated as the only competent authorities to resolve any legal dispute emerging from the Agreement between the Coordinating Institution and the Student. The present Agreement will be governed by the Polish law.
19. The Coordinating Institution and other SBBE Partner Institutions are exonerated from any responsibility for accidents, illnesses, injuries, losses or damages to persons or goods resulting from or in any way related to the activities that are the object of the present Agreement. The Student is obliged to accept all the provisions of obligatory insurance arranged by the Partner Institutions.
20. The Student is obliged to join the Erasmus Mundus Students and Alumni Association (EMA) <http://www.em-a.eu/>
21. The Agreement has been drawn up in four identical copies (one copy for the Student and three copies for the University).

The signatories declare that they have read and accept the conditions laid down in the present Agreement.
